Visitor Fact Sheet

Arranging a Visit

- ✓ We encourage scheduled visits with time frames to ensure our compliance with infection control and cleaning/disinfecting regulations.
- ✓ Visits may be subject to a limited number of visitors per resident as a means to maintain the core principles of infection prevention and social distancing.
- ✓ Visitors will be screened for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 upon arrival. If they fail the screening, the visit will be rescheduled. Visitors must provide contact information for contact tracing.
- ✓ Visitors must notify The Village, if they develop COVID-19 symptoms within two days of their visit.
- ✓ Visitation areas will be cleaned and sanitized between visits.
- ✓ The Village will encourage visitors to be COVID-19 tested prior to visit by means of a rapid test (or to be tested 2-3 days prior to visit); this is free of charge.

Outdoor Visitation

- ✓ Outdoor visitation is preferred, even when resident and visitor are fully vaccinated* against COVID-19. Outdoor visits generally pose a lower risk of transmission due to increased space and airflow. Therefore, visits should be held outdoors whenever practicable.

Indoor Visitation

- ✓ All visitation will occur in resident's room or in a common area if needed.
- ✓ If roommate is present, visits can occur in resident's room if social distancing can occur and masks are worn.

Visitation Expectations

- ✓ Social distancing of minimum of six feet is required.
- ✓ Gifts and personal items can be exchanged at visit.
- ✓ Masks/face coverings or other required PPE must be worn throughout the entire visit, regardless of vaccination status.
- ✓ Masks must cover the nose and mouth at all times.
- ✓ Meals may be shared with resident in a separate room. Masks must be worn when not eating or drinking and a distance of 6 feet must be maintained. If in common area, must be distanced from other residents.
- ✓ Hand sanitizing and/or hygiene should be done upon arrival and upon end of the visit.
- ✓ A fully vaccinated resident can have close contact (including touch) with a visitor while both are wearing masks and perform hand hygiene before and after visit.
- ✓ Visitors who are unable to adhere to the core principles of COVID-19 infection prevention will not be permitted to visit or will be asked to leave.

*Fully vaccinated: The vaccination status of a person who is greater than two weeks following receipt of the second dose in a valid two-dose series, or greater than two weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine.
